

2022 Midterms General Election Predictions

Report 1: Arizona, Florida, Michigan by Geoffrey Fields

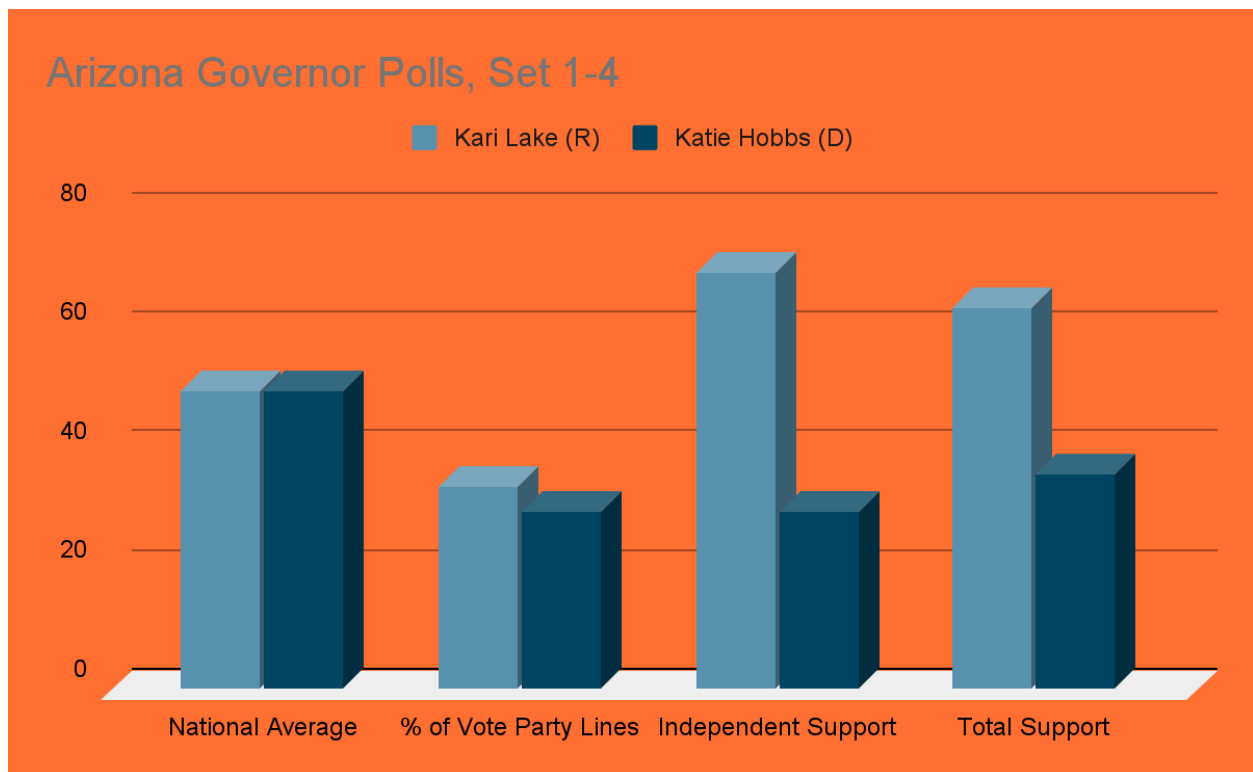
- Polls are based on average voter turnout per State ranging from 58-76%
- More votes are cast in Presidential Elections compared to Governor races, which represents turnout range per poll

ARIZONA

* Incumbent Doug Ducey will not seek reelection, Endorses Kari Lake

Candidate: Kari Lake - Republican Party Candidate, Trump-Backed, Strong on the border & election integrity. Won every county in AZ in her primary

Candidate: Katie Hobbs - Democratic Party Candidate, Soros-Backed Secretary of State running for Governor, Biden could be a liability for Hobbs polling shows

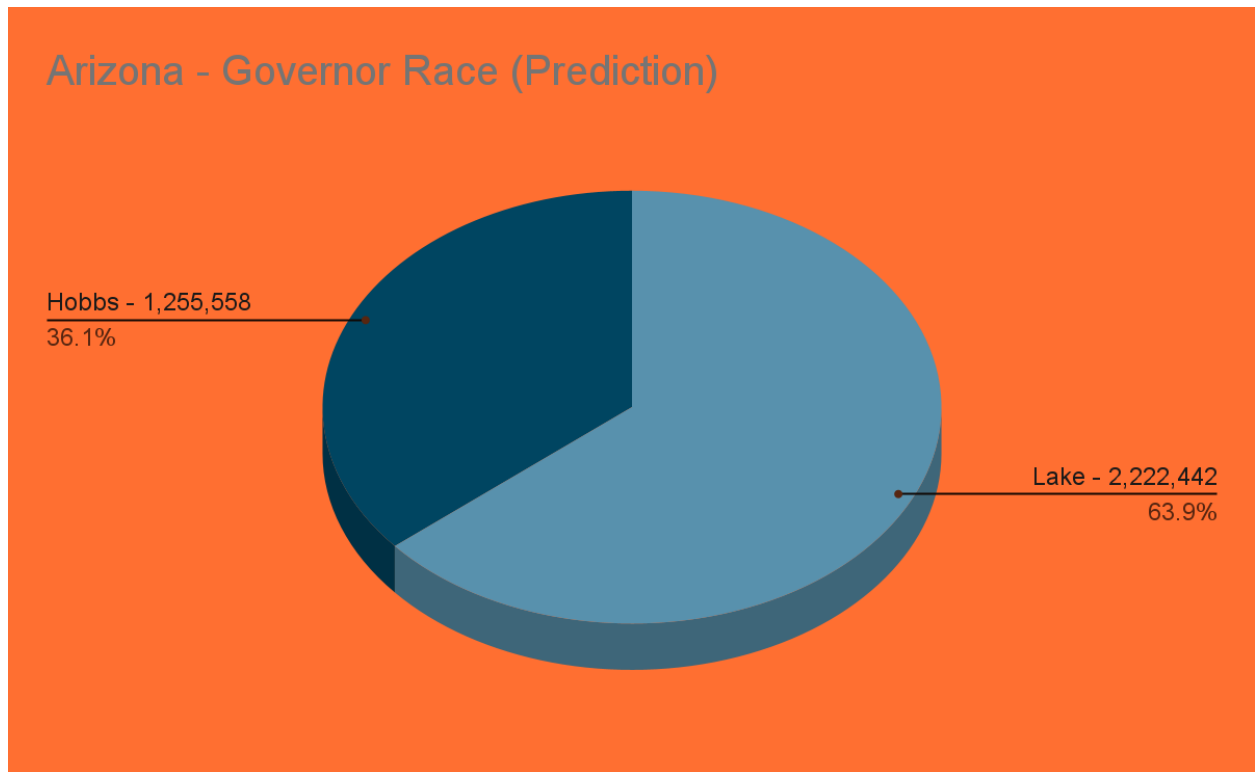


We see limited polling from the national media at the moment, Latest polls claim Arizona is a toss-up. Let's examine, Our analysis proves it's mathematically impossible for this race to be 50-50 as the mainstream media claims in national polls. Assuming both Kari and Katie are polling even at 50%, this narrative is blown up when you examine further.

Looking at Arizona's voting block as a whole, it's split among party lines and with independents almost equally. There are more registered Republicans, 34.1%, than registered Democrats, 29.8%, but there are more Independents 35% than both major parties. National polling is either ignoring independent support or arbitrarily giving that base to Hobbs, without warrant.

Arizona has a major voting block of independents. In fact, Per SOS there are 200,000 more independents than there are democrats in Arizona(GOP 1.6M - DEM 1.4M, IND 1.6M). When examining each candidate's support and enthusiasm among independents, it's not even close. Kari Lake polls in at 70% with this important voting block.

When you consider all factors, a Trump endorsement, Republicans have a small, but still an, advantage represented in the states voter rolls and their support among independents, Kari Lake will secure the victory in Arizona TTA predicts 63.9%-36.1%.

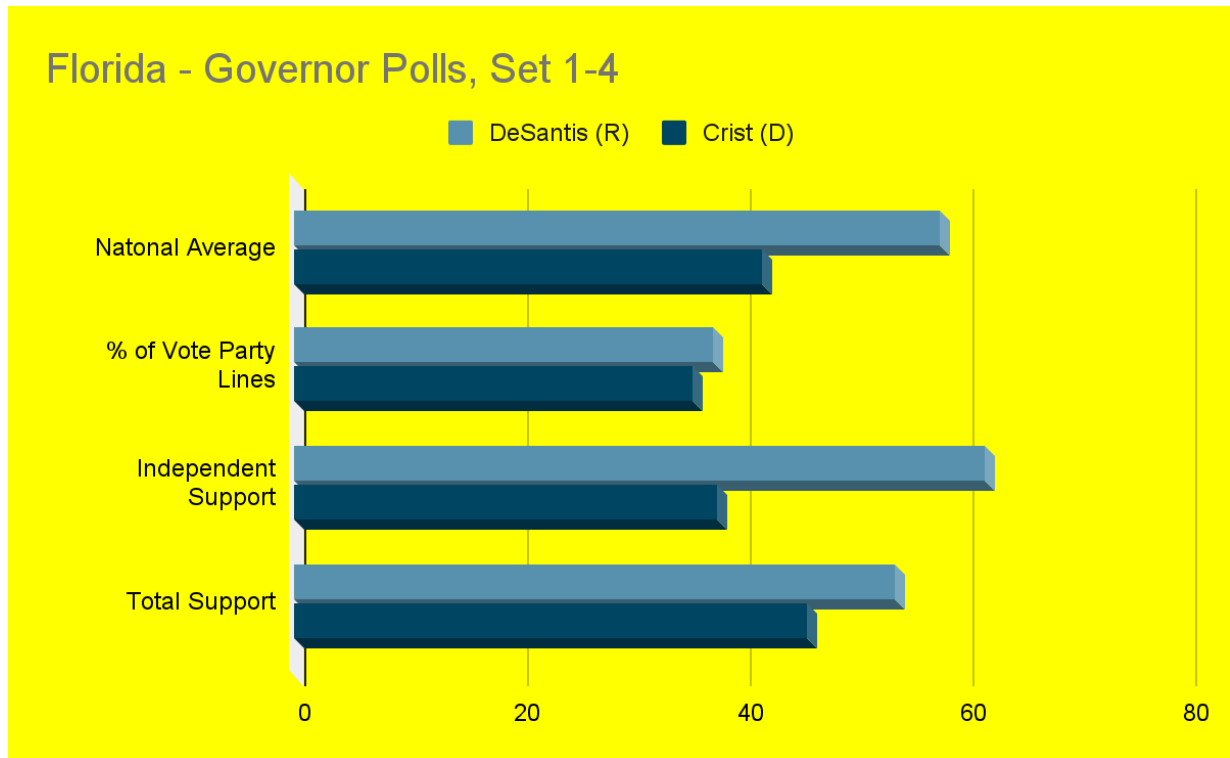

FLORIDA

Candidate: Ron Desantis - Republican Party Candidate, Incumbent; won in 2018, Trump-backed, America First, Heir to Trump's new Republican party, populist, Economic nationalist

Candidate: Charlie Crist, Democratic Party Candidate, Former Republican AG & Governor; Current Democrat, Soros-backed, endorsed Obama, Uni-party establishment

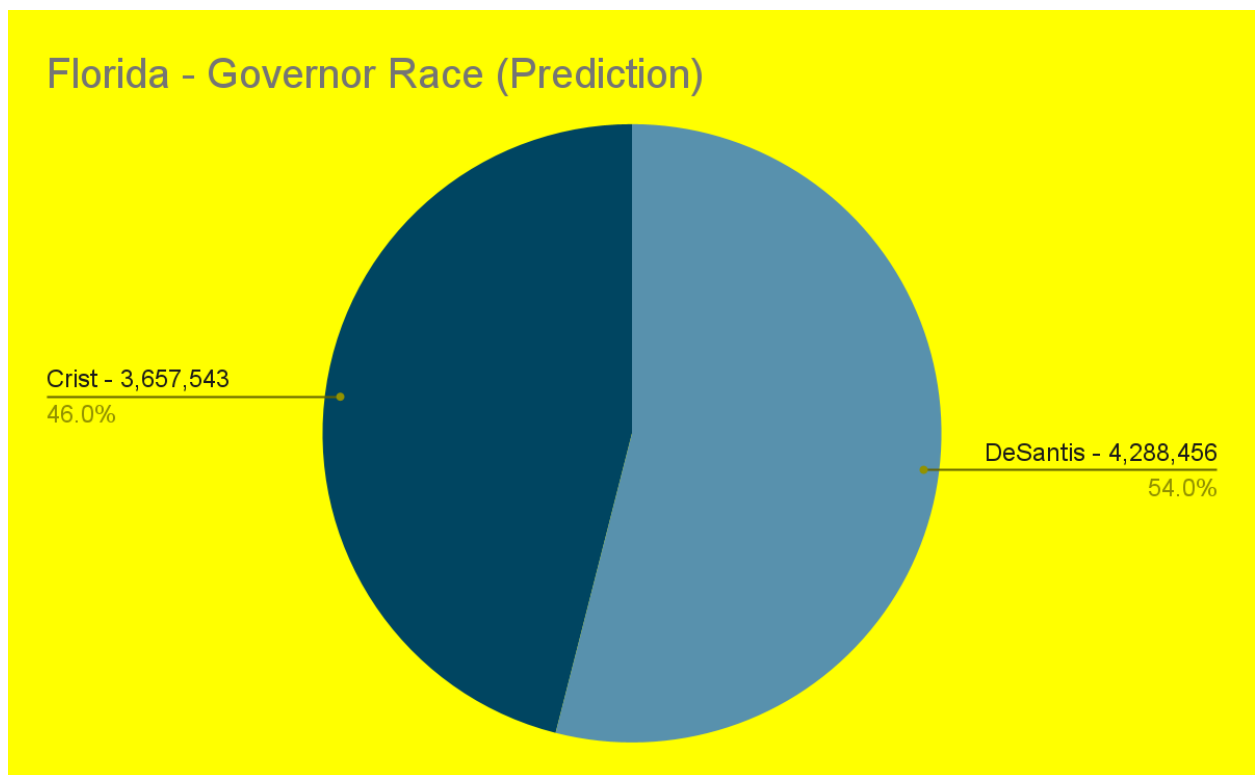


Florida Governor Ron DeSantis has become very popular on the national stage. Many consider him to be the frontrunner among Republicans to heir Trump's America First agenda and champion those principles for a potential run for the oval, in the coming years.

Our analysis shows DeSantis as the clear leader in this race. A reason he hasn't announced a 2024 bid as Trump's VP is that he is focused on winning in Florida first, perhaps. Crist, a career flip-flop will likely struggle to bring in support outside Democrat get out the vote initiatives. Governor in 2006, then turning Democrat and backing Obama, Dec 7, 2012, it's unlikely he will fool voters into thinking he is moderate.

Taking on Disney and Florida's woke education system DeSantis has built a strong base, pulling in at 58% in national polling Vs. Crist. Examining the voting rolls there are more Republicans, 5.1M, than Democrats, 4.9M, Again a staggering 3.7M independents. If voter turnout is even average, DeSantis is heavily favored.

Trump-Backed America First candidates are polling well with Independents nationwide around 60+%, this trend continues with Ron DeSantis. Pulling in 62% vs Crist 38%. Weighing support among Independents and strong GOP support, DeSantis we predict will secure victory in Florida, TTA predicts 53.97%-46.03%.

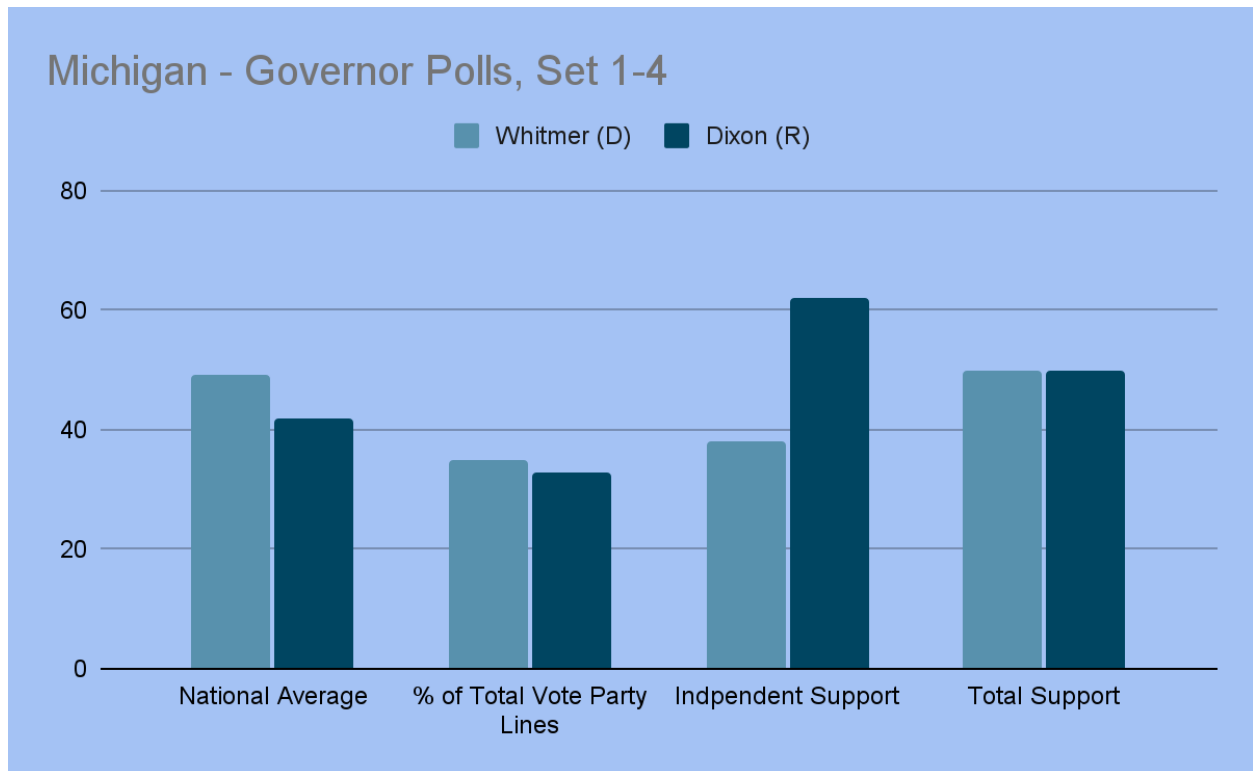

MICHIGAN

Candidate: Tudor Dixon - Republican Party Candidate, Trump-backed, ProLife, Running largely against Covid mandates imposed by Whitmer, Supports defunding planned parenthood

Candidate: Gretchen Whitmer - Democratic Party Candidate, Incumbent, Joe Biden Democrat, Popularity tied to Biden's policies, Massive spending since taking office

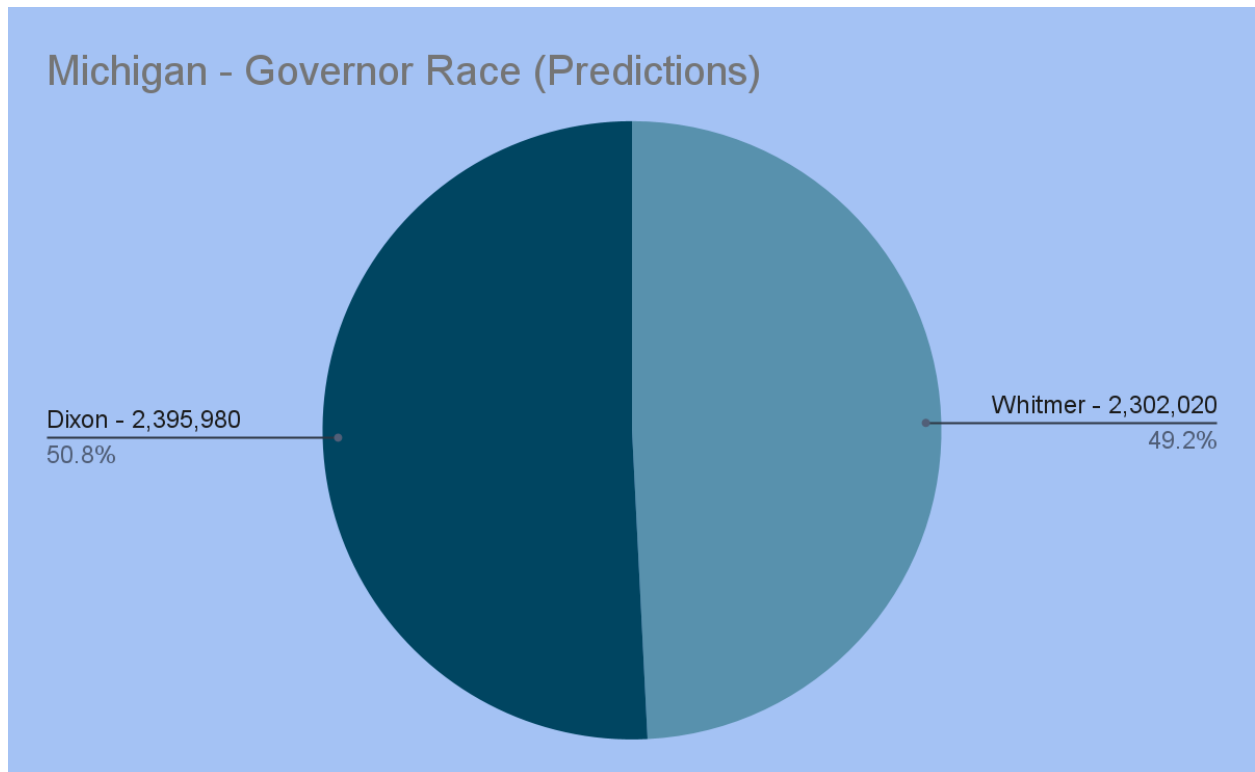


Michigan's elections will largely be decided by Independent voters. Incumbent, Gretchen Whitmer has been losing support among Independents dropping into the 30's. Tudor Dixon's path to victory lies with this voting block. Needing at least 50% to keep it close, netting 55-65% would likely be enough to push her ahead of Whitmer to secure the nomination.

Low turnout would spell disaster for the GOP. On Aug 2nd, the GOP Primaries only cast 905,000 voters or so, for all candidates combined. There are around 2.6 million republican voters in Michigan compared to 2.8 million Democrats voters. So, If Tudor is going to win she needs massive turnout and help from independents who account for 2.7 million voters.

We could potentially see a recount in this election. Credible polls show this race is a toss-up. Some mainstream media polls that show Whitmer +11 are leaving out independent voting blocks or oversampling Democrats. The majority of polls only survey 1,200 or fewer people. Very misleading and biased, clearly not representative. This race is closer to the margin of error than it is 11 points.

There are paths to victory for both candidates making this race the closest in the country potentially. TTA analysis predicts Tudor Dixon will beat Gretchen Whitmer in a historic election, 50.8%-49.2%.
